2. **Lead like Jesus by Ms Hee Piang Chin**

3. Leading and Managing Change by Rev. Dr Ong Hwai Teik

The hardest work in dealing with change is knowing what you must hold on to. In learning what you keep, it is easier to let go of other things

There are three key areas that are vital part of dealing with change in your leadership:

- a) Creating a culture that encourages asking questions. Not knowing is a hard part of change, but if you give people the freedom to ask questions you make creativity and learning an important part of the journey.
- b) Dialogue is vital to holding a team or organization together. If you cannot talk about something you cannot deal with it or change it. The hard work of change includes difficult conversation.
- c) Values form the DNA of our choices and thus our organization. Clarifying the values we agree to live and work by gives us the wisdom to move forward in harmony.

4 Engaging Youths Through The GB Programme by Pastor Chua Seng Lee

"How can we engage the youth today who are used to I-phone, I-touch, I-pod, I-pad, Wifi, PSP, etc? Living in this high speed, multi-media and wired environment, youth gets restless and impatient during the traditional lecturing mode of teaching. They need new approaches to help them stay engaged.

This workshop will help officers to gain some new ideas on engaging the youth effectively. Using some researched-based material, on Learning Style, officers would be helped to discover their own unique learning style as well as how to employ this knowledge in designing the weekly program. Interactive discussion, small group discussion and other teaching strategies would also be modeled in this workshop. Can and grow with us."

5. Habitudes by Ms Kelsey Young

6. Sarawak Handicraft by Sarawak team

In an area roughly the size of England live 27 distinct ethnic groups speaking more than 40 languages. Each group has its own culture, crafts and legends. This diversity is the fertile ground in which Sarawak creativity flourishes.

During the workshop, the whole process of making batik will be demonstrated and during the second part of the workshop, each participant will be given hand on experience of making her own bracelet using the local bead. (This workshop is limited to 60 pax only, it will be on first come first served basis)
